General Information

REGISTRATION

Registration is on a first-come, first-served basis. Enrollment will be limited. Half or full payment of fees is required to hold a place.

for camps held in July – June 17, 2011

Use the form on page 17 to register your child. Complete and return the medical/carpool consent form on page 18 for each camper. Confirmation letters will be e-mailed to you after the registration, medical/carpool consent forms and fees have been received.

EXTENDED CARE

Extended Care is provided from 7:30 a.m. to 8:30 a.m. and from 4:00 p.m. to 5:30 p.m. for an additional charge. Lunchtime Care is provided free of charge for those campers that attend a full-day camp or a combination of a morning camp and afternoon camp. Campers will need to bring a sack lunch and drink. During lunchtime, campers will be supervised while they have lunch, and during outdoor recess and games. Snacks will be provided for all camps.

FEES

Camp fees are listed with the camp description and include a \$25.00 non-refundable registration fee. Full refunds (minus the registration fee) are made for a cancellation prior to May 13 (for June camps) or June 17 (for July camps). 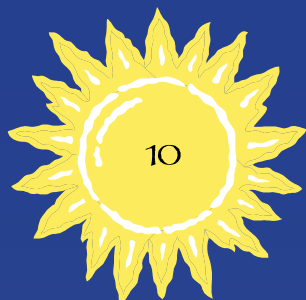

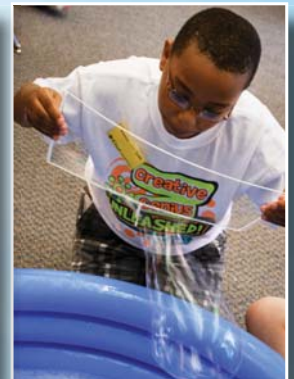

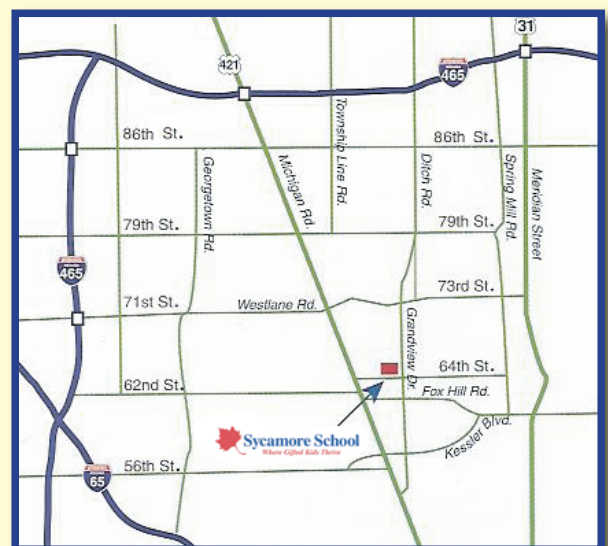
